The following scholarships applications are available in the School Counseling Office or on the Internet. If you are interested in receiving an application or further information about one of the listed scholarships, stop in the counseling office. Also check the websites of the college(s) you are looking at applying to attend. Many colleges have scholarships that you can apply to if you get accepted.

1. **ANYCOLLEGE.COM SCHOLARSHIP** – A college search engine that lists over 5,500 accredited colleges and universities in the U.S. Student may also sign up to win a \$1,000 scholarship, drawn four times per year. The site is free. Check in “Win a Scholarship” to sign up to win. Check [www.anycollege.com](http://www.anycollege.com) for information.
2. **AMERICAN LEGION SCHOLARSHIPS FOR VETERAN'S DEPENDENTS-Child/Children, or legally adopted child/children of active duty US Military and Guard, Reserve personnel who were federalized and died on active duty on or after September 11, 2001 is eligible for this scholarship. A student must be a high school senior or high school graduate to apply for the scholarship. Scholarships is for undergraduate study at a US school of high education. 3. **ARMED FORCES COMMUNICATIONS ELECTRONICS ASSOCIATION'S “Captain John A. Skinner Scholarship** – Up to eight \$10,000 scholarships per student, \$2,500 for each year of a four-year college education. The scholarship seeks to recognize outstanding graduating seniors for their past achievements and to aid them in accomplishing their career goals. Students must be planning to enter a science or engineering field of study supportive of national defense (i.e. telecommunications, computer sciences, mathematics, or other related technical electives.) GPA of at least 3.5 on a 4.0 scale, plus a combined SAT score of 1200. Applications can be picked up in the counseling office or at [www.afceacmd.org](http://www.afceacmd.org). **Deadline: December 19, 2009.**

4. **AXA ACHIEVEMENT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM** – 52 \$10,000 scholarships to graduating seniors (one from each state, Washington, D.C. and Puerto Rico). Additional scholarships to 10 National recipients. Students should be well rounded, determined to succeed and have demonstrated achievement. The first 12,000 applications received will be considered. **Deadline: December 15, 2009.**

5. **BALTIMORE COMMUNITY FOUNDATION-** Three separate scholarships are available to North Carroll Students through the Baltimore Community Foundation.

1. Christa McAuliffe Scholarship- The scholarship is for aspiring teachers in the State of Maryland. Seniors must be planning on attending a college in Maryland and intend to teach in Maryland. Scholarship is \$1000 and can be renewable.
2. Al Sanders Foundation for Music Studies Scholarship- Established for students who intend to major in music and pursue a career in music after graduation from college. Scholarship amount is \$1500.
3. WJZ-TV Jerry Turner Broadcast Scholarship- Established for students who intend to major in and pursue a career in broadcast journalism after graduation from college. Scholarship amount is \$1500.

6. **BOSTON UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIPS**

\*Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Scholarship Competition – The scholarship is designed to acknowledge highly able students who embrace the ideal of Dr. King. A GPA of 3.5 in a very demanding college preparatory curriculum, top 10% of graduating class, a SAT score of 1250 or higher on the Critical Reading and Math sections; a 600 or higher on the Writing are some criteria for selection. The application, nomination form and essay must be submitted by **December 1, 2009**. \***Trustee Scholarship Competition**—it recognizes students with outstanding academic ability and the potential to inspire fellow students to excel. Students are typically in the top 1% of class with a perfect 4.00, Average score of SAT 1529 and Average Act 34. Volunteer service and contributions to school and community are additional criteria. 7. **CHESAPEAKE BAY TRUST'S 2010 HONRABLE ARTHUR DORMAN SCHOLARSHIP.** Maryland residents who are full time high school seniors or college

undergraduates who demonstrates a commitment to the environment and the Chesapeake Bay, shares in a minority ethnic or cultural heritage, demonstrates active involvement in promoting diversity and improving respect between people of all backgrounds, has a 3.0 GPA or better and has strong leadership skills in school and community initiatives may apply to win a \$5000 scholarship. 8. **COMCAST LEADERS AND ACHIEVERS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM**-This \$1000 award is given to recognize high school seniors for their commitment to community service, academics, and leadership. One student from North Carroll can be nominated. A preliminary application can be submitted to Ms. Cunningham and then the school will choose one student to be nominated for this scholarship. The preliminary application is available in the counseling office and **must be returned to Ms. Cunningham by November 20, 2009.** The student who is chosen will be given further information on completing the formal application on line.
9. **Council for America's First Freedom** The First Freedom Student Competition is a national essay contest offering 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade students an opportunity to compete for awards, as they examine the history, current importance and relevance of religious freedom in their lives. Awards range from \$750-\$3000. You will need a sponsorship from a current or former Social Studies or English teacher. 10. **DAUGHTERS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION SCHOLARSHIPS-** DAR has several scholarships offered for various amounts and majors in college. Amounts range from \$500 a year to \$2000. Several Scholarships:
  - a) Maryland DAR Scholarship-\$500 scholarships will be awarded to a US citizen who plans to attend an accredited college pursuing an Associate or Bachelor's degree. Scholarships are renewable for an additional three years with a 3.0 or better in college. Completed applications need to be received by December 1.
  - b) Pittenger and Hobbs American History Scholarship- A \$2000 scholarship for up to 4 years will be awarded to a graduating high school senior who have a concentrated study of a minimum of 24 credit hours in American History or Government while in college. Deadline is February 15.
  - c) C.E. Holt Nursing Scholarship- A one-time \$1000 scholarship for students who are in financial need and have been accepted or are currently enrolled in an accredited school of nursing. Deadline is February 15.
  - d) Lillian and Arthur Dunn Scholarship- A \$2000 award for up to four years to a well qualified, deserving sons and daughters of members of NSDAR for four years of college. Deadline is February 15.
  - e) Madeline Pickett Halbert Cogswell Nursing Scholarship- A one-time \$1000 scholarship who have been accepted or are currently enrolled in an accredited school

of nursing, who are members of NSDAR, descendants of members of NSDAR or are eligible to be members of NSDAR. Deadline is February 15.

11. **ELKS NATIONAL FOUNDATION LEGACY AWARDS**- 4 year, \$4,000 scholarship to the children and grandchildren of Elk members who are high school seniors planning to attend college. 12. **JOHN F. KENNEDY PROFILE IN COURAGE ESSAY CONTEST** Essays must demonstrate an understanding of President Kennedy's definition of political courage. First place winner will receive \$5000, second-place winner will receive \$1000 and up to 5 third place winners will receive \$500. 13. **KFC Colonel's Scholars Program**- The KFC Colonel's Scholars Program is looking for high school seniors with entrepreneurial drive, strong perseverance, demonstrated financial need, and who want to pursue a college education at an accredited public institution in the state they reside. 14. **Martin K.P. and Kelly W. HILLS SCHOLAR PROGRAM**- Students planning on attending Carroll Community College and has SAT scores of 1100+ (math and reading), is in the top 15% of their graduating class or have a cumulative GPA of a 3.2 can apply for the Hill Scholars Program. Scholarships are awarded based on success in this program. Deadline is in December. **Information night at Carroll Community on this program is on November 10, 2009 from 6:30-8:00 or is available in the counseling office.**
15. **Maryland Pathways Program, University of Maryland at College Park**- The program is for Maryland residents with high financial need to attend college at College Park for free. Qualifying students will receive sufficient grants funds to cover tuition, fees, room board and books. To be eligible, a student must be dependent, a Maryland Resident student and eligible fore the Auto-Zero EFC calculation. Students must also apply for the Guaranteed Access Grant in early February. 16. **NATIONAL CO-OP SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM** The National Commission for Cooperative Education will offer 175 merit co-op scholarships to students who plan on attending one of the following schools: CW Post Campus of Long Island University, Drexel University, Johnson & Wales University, Kettering University, Northeastern University, Pace University, Rochester Institute of Technology, University of Cincinnati, University of Toledo or Wentworth Institute of Technology. 17. **NFIB Young Entrepreneur Award**- Seniors who have demonstrated entrepreneurial spirit and initiative such as starting his or her own business, participated in clubs or organizations such as Future Business Leaders of America or through other initiatives and is interested in going onto college may be eligible for scholarships ranging from \$10,000 to \$1000. 18. **OH THE PLACES YOU'LL GO SCHOLARSHIP**- Dr. Seuss's *Oh, the Places You'll Go!* College \$5000 Scholarship recognizes a high school senior who understands and values the limitless possibilities that educations can offer with a scholarship award. **Application and criteria can be downloaded at [www.ohtheplaces.org](http://www.ohtheplaces.org) or picked up in the school counseling office. 19. **THE PRINCETON PRIZE IN REACE RELATIONS**- \$1000 cash award for a student who is doing outstanding work in their school or community to advance the cause of race relations. 20. **SAE ENGINEERING SCHOLARSHIPS** – Two scholarship programs are available:
- \***Undesignated scholarships**—Applicant must enroll in an engineering program accredited by the Accrediting Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET) at a university of the applicant's choice. GPA and SAT/ACT scores are some selection criteria. Scholarships range from \$1,000 to \$10,000.   - \***University Sponsored Scholarships**—These scholarships are sponsored by participating universities and colleges, and range in value from \$500 to full tuition. It is the student's responsibility for filing application for admission to the college or university. College/university participants are listed on scholarship application. 21. **SONS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION ESSAY CONTEST**- This essay contest is for an original researched and proven topic that deals with an event, person, philosophy, or ideal associated with the American Revolution, the Declaration of Independence, or the framing of the United States Constitution. State and National awards will be awarded. **Deadline is December 31, 2009.** Open to students in 10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade

22. **SUNTRUST OFF TO COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP SWEEPSTAKES** – High school seniors can win a \$1,000 scholarship for their first year expenses at an accredited college or private career school. One winner will be chosen every two weeks from October through May. Students may register at [www.offtocollege.info](http://www.offtocollege.info) beginning September 14. Only one entry per person for each drawing, however students can register after each drawing for the next scheduled drawing.
23. **Town of Hampstead Scholarship**- Three \$1000 scholarships will be awarded to students who reside within the municipal boundaries of the Town of Hampstead. Applicants must be a North Carroll Student who has been accepted into a college or university, have a “B” average or better in high school. The applicant must have demonstrated a commitment to the community. Scholarships are based on financial need. Begin preparing for the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid). You should apply between January 1, 2010 and February 1, 2010 (check your college deadlines). Applying by the paper method will take at least 3 weeks to process. If you apply by the internet process, the application will be processed within 3 days. Pin numbers will be given when you apply for the FAFSA. This PIN number will be good throughout your college career. Please keep it for all years needed. If you have questions, see your counselor in the School Counseling Office.
